

# The Ian Potter Foundation Evaluation Pool (TIPFEP) 2018

As The Ian Potter Foundation moves towards more strategic grant-making, we have created a pool of high-quality evaluators that we can recommend. Selection was predominantly based on submissions via an open call on the Australasian Evaluation Society website.

This year, our focus was increasing the number of evaluators with background in economics. Outstanding submissions have been added to last years' pool. Although candidates by default remain on the list, again, the overall calibre of submissions increased, and several evaluators were removed from the previous years' pool. All selected candidates submitted a work sample to the Foundation with strong outcomes measurement and experience with

government sector. The vast majority also had excellent financial analysis abilities, this is noted where this is not the case.

This document is organised by program area and will be shared with grantees (prospective, past and current) and other foundations to improve the quality of evaluations conducted for philanthropically-funded projects.
